## **Trip Report, Christmas Bird Count Summary**

Date: 12/20/03 (Rescheduled from 12/14/03)

**Weather**: Clear in AM, scattered clouds in PM. Temperatures ranged from 26 to 38°F. Scattered patches of snow. Most inland ponds covered with ice.

**Feeder Counters**: William Fahan, Jean Heyl, Laurence Pringle, Nancy Slowik, Mayneal Wayland. The original count date, 12/14/03, unfortunately coincided with a major Nor'Easter. We tried to notify as many participants as possible that the CBC was rescheduled. Some feeder counters did not receive word and counted on the 12/14. While their counts cannot be included in the official report, their efforts are included in the preliminary list below and are greatly appreciated. (Only Laurence Pringle recounted on 12/20/03.)

**Coverage**: 229 miles traveled by car, 31.5 miles traveled by foot (preliminary).

**Results**: A total of 18,961 individuals representing 70 species, were counted by the field observers. An additional 454 individuals were added by the feeder counters. Counts were higher than 2002. During that year, 16,623 individuals from 78 species were counted. Based on previous results (see below), the number of individuals and species are within historic ranges. Of note, however, are the numbers of American Crow. Their numbers have declined sharply over recent years: 15,523 in 2000; 3,935 in 2001; 1,769 in 2002; and 354 in 2003. (Some of the decline might be explained by changes in counting effort, but it is likely that the West Nile Virus is the major cause.)

**Highlights**: The North Rockland Team finding \$6.11 in cold, hard cash! The good showing of Bald Eagles; at least seven were seen. The North Rockland Team couldn't help admiring the resourcefulness shown by a beaver at Haverstraw County Park (see **Photo 10**).

The Eastern Meadowlark seen at Haverstraw Landfill on Sunday was an exceptional sighting. This is only the second CBC sighting (albeit Count Week, rather than Count Day) since 1971. The last one was seen in 1991. Good spotting Della!
